This is the best self-adhesive backing in the market. Made for hard hoop items. Peel away release paper, adhere to the garment, embroider your design then simply tear away the paper. **Tools needed: Scissors.**



Step 1: A roll of the single sided backing material.
NOTE: This material is slightly thicker/stiffer than the double sided material. Best used for thin/light material.



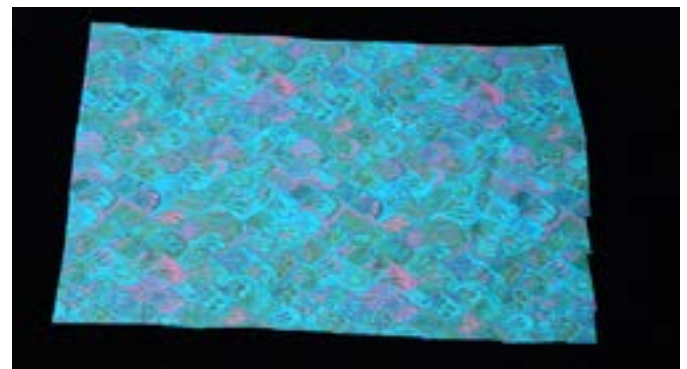
Step 2: Starting at one corner, peel back the roll to the approximate size that you need for your fabric.

Double Sided Backing



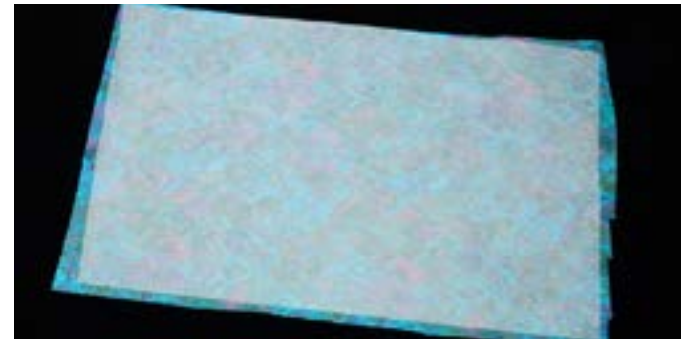
Step 3: A close up of the **Single Sided Backing** (left photo). The Single sided backing is stiffer and has a cotton look to it.



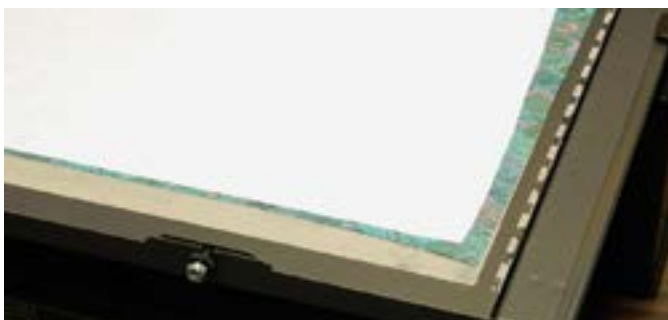
Step 4: The light weight fabric is first laid down.



Step 5: The second step is to apply the single sided backing to your fabric as shown. Press down on the backing with one hand while pulling the backing release paper off.



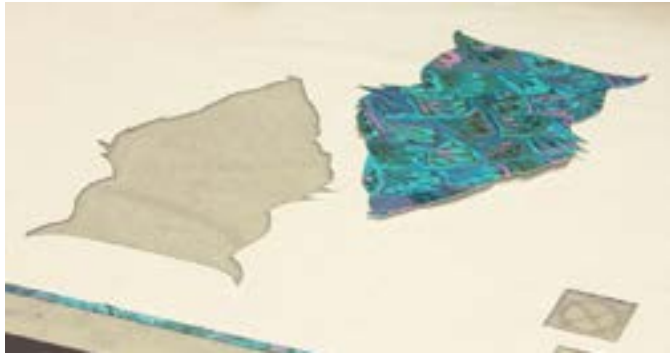
Step 6: This is how it should appear after you have applied the single sided backing to your fabric.



Step 7: Lay down the fabric with the backing attached to your 300/350 tray as shown.



Step 8: Create a test cut first to determine the proper blade depth, force and cut quality.



Step 9: Cut your design. This photo shows the design already has been cut and removed.



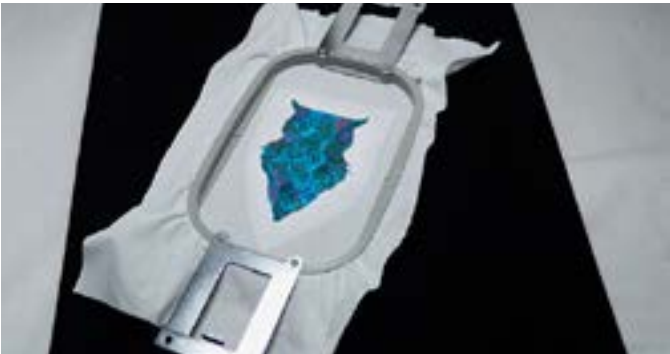
Step 10: With the design removed from the 300/350 tray, peel off the single sided backing as shown.



Step 11: Create a placement stitch on the fabric in the hoop.



Step 12: Then place the fabric inside the outline as shown.



Step 13: Once the cut fabric is placed on the material that you will be using, you can begin your stitching until complete. **...FINISHED**
